Dina Shenhav

Israeli artist Dina Shenhav uses materials like ash and foam, which she admits are very “uncommon mediums” in art. Her inspiration comes from “domestic scenes” and “urban life.” For this year's ArtCenter installation during Art Basel, Shenhav created an entire

hunter's cabin made exclusively out of foam. She explains that "the softness of the foam counters the harsh inanimate objects" like shotguns and deer heads.

"I am influenced by the phenomena of manmade violence in nature. In many ways, it is my way of coping with the atrocities that man does to its own human race and animals."

Brand new to Miami, Shenhav has plenty to experience during Art Basel. She says she is particularly looking forward to visiting the "Untitled Art Fair" to see installations by groundbreaking artists like Maurizio Cattelan and Pierpaolo Ferrari.
